For over thirty years, Serenity House has served individuals in need and currently serves approximately 1500 persons each year. Collaborative partnerships with community providers are essential in accessing services that enhance long term recovery.

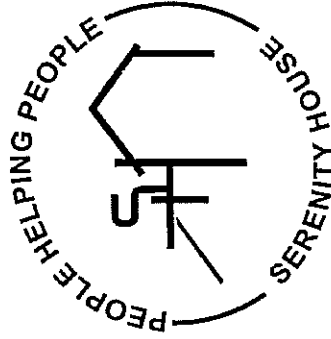

Intake Evaluations

Provides comprehensive assessment and referral services for homeless persons, individuals in the justice system and voluntary referrals.

Outpatient Program

Provides a 12-week outpatient substance abuse counseling program for individuals with substance abuse disorders. Services include individual and group counseling.

Provides day treatment, aftercare, relapse prevention and supportive services for women whose needs can be met in a therapeutically supportive living environment.

Substance Abuse Unit: Provides a therapeutic residential treatment environment which includes intensive counseling, individual/group therapy and intensive care management for adult males with serious substance disorders.

Family Intervention Treatment Solution

Provides a full range of substance abuse services for referrals from Volusia County's Dependency and Family courts. Services provided include evaluation, group/family counseling, day treatment, residential placement, case management and advocacy.

Provides aftercare housing and community support following successful completion of residential treatment. Focuses on reintegration into the community and developing relapse prevention skills.

PATH Program

Jail Diversion Program: Provides treatment interventions, including a range of educational and rehabilitative services, for selected individuals charged with minor criminal offenses on a fee for service basis. Referrals can be made by attorneys in consultation with the State Attorney's office.

IPN Program (Intervention Project for Nurses): Individualized services including outpatient and residential, for impaired professionals available through referral by the Intervention Project for Nurses Board.

Serenity House is an approved Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) and provides safe and sober permanent housing opportunities for low and very-low income, high-risk individuals. Housing placement leads to a decrease in homelessness and improved quality of life.

Corrections Treatment Diversion

Program (CTDP) (386) 252-4228, ext. 22
The Corrections Treatment Diversion Program offers opportunities to address our community's interrelated problems of drug abuse, mental illness, jail overcrowding, high recidivism rates and limited access to care. The program offers individuals sentenced to more than 120 days in jail on drug related charges the opportunity to enter a 60 day in-jail program. Upon successful completion of this component, the sentences in amended and the inmate is released to community based treatment. While in the community, the client will continue to attend treatment and receive intensive case management and court liaison services, for up to a year.
